#### Greater Smartwater Coverage

Working with Terry Heyes and John Levett of Burton Green Neighbourhood Watch, Kenilworth's SNT have extended the coverage of Smartwater.

Signs now display Smartwater coverage on all approaches to Burton Green. Smartwater is considered as a major deterrent to criminals because it's traceable back to individual properties and it cannot be removed from items treated with it

The move to this proactive and engaged approach shows what can be done by residents in conjunction with their SNT and reduce the risk of crime.

#### **Help Yourself – Summer Bargains!**

It's an unusual headline to find in Kenilworth Update but it's borne out of a sense of frustration arising from the work we do.

In May's edition the issue of leaving garage doors open and property left on view inside motor vehicles was covered. The SNT team have come across more examples and in some instances have experienced hostility from residents when they have sought to point out they are placing themselves at risk of being a victim of crime.

For Kenilworth to keep crime low means we all have a part to play. The police, without the active support of the community, cannot protect property and prevent crime as effectively as they can when folk follow simple advice.

# Crime Update Kenilworth - June 2013



#### Creeper Burglaries

Two recent burglaries in Kenilworth have highlighted the need to keep windows and doors secure and this extends to warm weather and at night. At one home offenders entered the house through an insecure door and carried out a search of the premises. The resident of the house woke up in the early hours of the morning, saw two offenders in the bedroom and then discovered that the offenders had made off with a quantity of cash from a purse, and a gold bracelet.

The offenders are described as males aged between 30 and 40 years. They had light hair and were wearing light coloured tops.

Also during the same night which was 1st June - The same night offenders forced open a window at another home in Ashdene Gardens but failed to get into the house and nothing was stolen.

Then at just after 4am on I June the elderly resident of a home in Ash Drive, Kenilworth woke up to find an offender in his bedroom. The offender made off through a rear window with several items.

#### Another Car Key Burglary!

Last month we stressed the importance of not leaving car keys near to the front door or even hung up nearby to it. Early in June another car was stolen in the early hours off a residential drive. Significant damage was done to the property frontage to gain access to the home for the simple aim of obtaining keys to the motor vehicle. The keys were just inside and the vehicle was stolen.

#### Busy Night in Kenilworth reinforces worth of following SNT's advice

#### Incident 356 of 23 May

At some point before 9.30pm on 23 May, offenders smashed the cat flap at the rear of a home in Woodland Road, Kenilworth in an attempt to get into the house. The offenders failed to get in and nothing was stolen.

#### Incident 27 of 27 May

At just after 2am on 27 May offenders smashed the window in the rear door of a home in Crackley Hill, Kenilworth.The resident of the house then disturbed the offenders who quickly made off.

#### Incident 208 of 27 May

At some point before 4.30pm on 27 May offenders attempted to get in to another home in Crackley Hill, Kenilworth through a rear door. The door and frame were damaged in the incident but the offenders failed to get into the house and nothing was stolen.

#### Incident 57 of 27 May

During the night of 26 into 27 May offenders broke a window in the lounge of a home in Bullimore Grove, Kenilworth and entered the house to steal a handbag. The handbag contained the keys to a Mercedes vehicle which was then stolen from outside.



## Advice Update

### Kenilworth - June 2013



Last month we focused on ourselves, that's each one of us that lives in or around Kenilworth. All manner and volume of advice is meaningless unless we each STOP and think this could be ME! We are probably all guilty of thinking crime is what happens to others, ask anyone that's been the victim of crime and they are likely to say they thought the same! They seldom think the same again though!

Again this month our Safer Neighbourhood Team have spotted a number of examples of "Help Yourself" invites to criminals. We each need to ask are we helping ourselves or helping criminals?

#### **Car Key Burglaries**

Put Car Keys Away - Don't leave them on show or within reach

The temptation is to put your keys down once you get inside your home somewhere you can easily pick them up when you need them next. Often this means a table or shelf near the entrance to your home.

Unfortunately, it's very easy and convenient for 'fishing thieves' who can easily hook the keys up through the letterbox and be away in your cherished motor before you even know your car is no longer outside. If you own a high performance car some thieves are prepared to break in to your home to get keys so don't make it easy for them.

## Summer Crime Warning from Beat Manager PC Pete King & Sergeant Dave Kettle of Warwick District Rural Safer Neighbourhood Teams

The two police officers with responsibility for Kenilworth have issued a warning to residents about the need to protect ourselves from crime and heed police advice.

Beat Manager for Kenilworth, PC Pete King said "Kenilworth's Safer Neighbourhood Team (SNT) is doing all it can by working with all sections of the community to help prevent crime. Over the past few weeks, whilst on patrol members of SNT have noticed insecure premises, garage doors left open with property on view and valuable items such as sat nav devices left on show in vehicles. We need people to respond to our advice and avoid helping criminals making them the next victim of crime."

Sergeant Kettle added "The message around keeping properties secure in the summer months is a perennial one, however this year it is more pertinent than ever. Recent burglaries in Kenilworth and surrounding villages clearly show that currently there are burglars solely targeting houses which are not left secure - be it through unlocked doors and patios or open ground floor windows. Whilst concerted efforts are being made to identify and arrest these offenders it is far preferable to not become a victim in the first place. The advice is simple but worth repeating, please make sure your property is secure when going out, no matter how short the period, or when retiring to bed."

## Kenilworth - June 2013



Recent events in Kenilworth remind us why the burglar sees summer as his friend. It's a time when everybody is enjoying their gardens. The doors are left wide open and the hot sticky nights (when we get 'summer' weather!) can mean that every window in the house, which is capable of being opened, maybe opened to its full extent. At these times, even the car is not immune from lapses in security. Windows are wound down and the open sunroof never closes.

Burglars welcome summer. They are opportunists by nature. To them, hot days and warm evenings signal rich pickings. Last summer, some residential areas in the UK, suffered several 'creeper' burglaries committed in the late evenings or early mornings. On each occasion, the thief only had to reach through an open ground floor window to steal. In some instances, they went into houses through open windows and unlocked patio doors. Forget what they stole for a moment; imagine one of your family coming face to face with him in your home in the middle of the night! It doesn't bear thinking about.

By all means open your first floor windows. Turn on the fans. But at night, keep your ground floor doors and windows firmly closed and locked.

## To the burglar, summer days are as welcome as summer nights and the daytime brings its own opportunities...

We all love to get out into our gardens. Our summers can be unpredictable so we have to take every chance to work in the garden when we can. For some reason, most of us feel that if we are on our property nobody is going to attack it. This false sense of security often leads us to leave doors and windows open all around the house despite the fact that we can only be in one place at one time.

In the last couple of months in Kenilworth our Police Community Support Officers have found garage doors wide open in residential streets. They have gone to point this out to home owners and have walked around the property and the open premises often filled with mountain bikes, power tools, lawn mowers and other garden tools completely unchallenged. Just think - what if they had been a burglar – talk about easy pickings! A minority have been hostile when these vulnerabilities have been pointed out. Some people seem happy to potter about in the front garden and are quite happy to leave the back door wide open. If the barbecue is in the back garden, surely it is safe to leave the front windows and even the front door open.....Well, it's not.


The thief is well aware of our habits. They can see where you are and, more to the point, they can see where you are not. It's a simple matter and a calculated risk for them to slip into your house, steal something valuable and slip out again – and remember they only need need a few seconds, most burglaries are over within 2 minutes! The burglar's ingenuity knows no bounds. For instance, a youngster knocks on your front door. He or she says "My ball has gone over into your garden", or "My rabbit has got out and I think it's got into your garden".

Being of a kind nature, you go to search for the missing item leaving the front door open. When you return, the rabbit or ball is still missing, the youngster is missing and the antique clock that was standing in your hallway is also missing or the car keys have gone and your car too. Even if you take the youngster with you to assist in the search, an accomplice will be waiting in the wings to complete the dirty deed.

The thief relies on surprise and opportunity. He feeds off the good and trusting nature of the average householder. But, if you don't provide them with simple opportunities, you are less likely to become one of this summer's victims of crime.

#### **BURGLARS HAVE GOT TALENT!**



# The 3 Current priorities for Kenilworth's Safer Neighbourhood Team

- 1. Ten Patrols to deter and check on Anti Social Behaviour at the recreational area between Ashdene Gardens, Elmdene Road and the alley between Lime Grove and Brooke Road, this is known by many as "Black Pad".
- 2. Ten Patrols in Burton Green, namely Red Lane, Cromwell Lane, Hodgetts Lane, and Hob Lane, in support of the force burglary initiative. Also as a response to a couple of recent burglaries thus providing reassurance.
- 3. Five speed/enforcement/monitoring sessions in Leyes Lane at school start and end times to prevent road traffic/pedestrian injury.

**Kenilworth Update** is produced by Crown Watch, one of the longest running Neighbourhood Watch schemes in Kenilworth and Warwickshire. Crown Watch serves the northern end of Windy Arbour, eastern end of Whitemoor Road and Tulip Tree Avenue. It publishes Newsletters and Crime Alerts to its Co-ordinators who circulate these to residents.

Since mid 2011 Crown Watch has been working closely with Kenilworth's Safer Neighbourhood Team to produce **Kenilworth Update**. The purpose of this is to encourage more people to set up and run their own Neighbourhood Watch schemes but also to inform people through an increasing range of channels what is going on in and around the town in terms of keeping our town safe. All of the work is done voluntarily.



The Secretary of State for Transport, Patrick McLoughlin, announced on 3 June 2013 that Kenilworth in Warwickshire is to receive £5m from the New Stations Fund for its railway station to be re-opened. This means the station re-opening, that the town has campaigned for over many years, will now go ahead with Warwickshire County Council providing additional funds. It will be constructed on the site of the original station closed in the 1960's as result of Beeching's Reshaping Report.

Network Rail are planning to integrate the station re-opening with other works on the line which include electrification (due to the route being part of a south east north west freight "spine") as well as general works to improve capacity (doubling the line from its current single status which may involve a second overbridge on the nearby A46).

The plans for the station will include two 100m platforms that will take four coach trains together with provision for these to be lengthened in future. It is hoped the station could be open within the next couple of years, an announcement on the re-opneing date is expected later this year.

The station site is currently used by a building materials supplier but has already been compulsorarily purchased by Warwickshire Coynty Council. The brick building in the yard on the right is the one and only building left from the original station. On 4 June 2013 a passenger train heads away south with a Manchester to Bournemouth service past the proposed station site on the right.
