During the last month the new Police priorities have been voted and put in place, Speed checks in Burton Green, parking issues around St Johns School and regular burglary patrols covering all of Kenilworth have won the votes. We will maintain these for the next three months and continue to act accordingly where necessary.

There has been several tickets issued by the team for speeding and parking obstructions and we have also issued fines for breach of the Covid rules. We take this very seriously and will continue to do so and with have the support from the residents which is appreciated.

I hope you're all staying safe! This month saw us have our community forum whereby our priorities for the next three months were set (see above), we have already made a start on these with 2 tickets issued for excess speed in Burton Green and patrols around St Johns School.

We have seen a worrying increase in "keyless" thefts of cars over the last month and I would encourage everyone to invest in a good quality steering lock and also a vehicle tracker should the worst happen. You can also invest in faraday bags which block criminals from cloning your key signal.

As I'm sure you can appreciate a lot of our work we cannot publicise but what we can share with you we do and I would encourage you to follow us on Facebook and Twitter to see some of the good results we get as a team!

We have continued to pro-actively patrol Kenilworth and enforce the COVID lockdown when we have come across blatant breaches of the law. As a team we have issued a total of 65 Fixed Penalty Notices since the lockdown began in January. I am pleased that there is light at the end of the tunnel and look forward to our team being able to run community events once more with you. I would like to say thank you for all the support and kind words you have given to the team – It really is nice to hear and is much appreciated.

How are lockdown rules changing in England?

What's already changed?

- Schools and colleges have reopened, and university students can return for practical courses
- Two people from different households can meet outside for recreation, which can include "a coffee on a bench"
- Care home residents can have one nominated visitor, with testing and social distance precautions

What's going to happen on 29 March?

- People will be allowed to meet outside, either with one other household or within the "rule of six", including in private gardens
- The "stay at home" rule will end, but the government will urge people to stay local as much as possible
- Outdoor sport facilities will reopen, including golf courses and tennis and basketball courts, and formally organised outdoor sports can restart
- Weddings can take place, attended by up to six people

Stage two (no earlier than 12 April):

- All shops allowed to open, along with close-contact services, including hairdressers and beauty salons (including in people's homes)
- Restaurants and pubs allowed to serve food and alcohol to customers sitting outdoors
- Gyms and spas can reopen, as can zoos, theme parks, libraries and community centres
- Members of the same household can take a holiday in England in self-contained accommodation
- Weddings attended by up to 15 people can take place
