Anti-Social Behaviour

ASB includes a range of nuisance and criminal behaviours which cause distress to others. Whether someone's actions can be classed as ASB relies heavily on the impact it has on other people. Behaviour that is more frequent or persistent is more likely to be considered as ASB. The type and intensity of the behaviour also matters. Landlords, the police, and local authorities consider all these factors when deciding how best to deal with reports of anti-social behaviour. Each report is looked at individually by considering the suffering of the victims and the impact on the wider community. Useful advice about how to deal with a problem neighbour can be found at [Citizens Advice](#) or [ASB Help](#).

If a crime has not taken place – can you resolve the situation yourself? If you can, please attempt to do so safely. If not, then contact your landlord, local authority, police or CAW for advice.

The police are a key partner for social landlords and local authorities in tackling ASB. They can act as a highly visible deterrent to perpetrators and their presence can also provide reassurance to affected communities. The police's core responsibilities include protecting life and property, preserving order, preventing the committing of offences, and bringing offenders to justice. The police may need to work with social landlords and local authorities to:

arrest perpetrators, prevent and deter incidents from taking place, support victims and protect people from the impact of anti-social behaviour.

SNT have responsibility for working with partners at the community level to develop sustainable solutions to ASB issues.

Hello everyone, the team have really been enjoying getting out into the community this month. It's been a glorious way to get into the summer and seeing everyone.

The carnival was back, which was great. The Kenilworth and Warwick Rural East team had a stand there which was great. PCSO King from the rural team was able to meet and speak to many of the residents and visitors who travelled to visit Abbey Fields.

We have been continuing to conduct anti-social behaviour patrols which have been good. We are getting questions about e-scooters and the law, as a few residents have flagged up about them being ridden dangerously. The law states they are illegal to ride on a public footpath, road or open space unless part of a government trial scheme (which we are not a part of), so a polite reminder that these should not be ridden anywhere on the public highway and if warnings are ignored the e-scooters will be seized.

Speed Checks on Cromwell Lane, Burton Green led to 72 speeding tickets being issued during our speed checks along with some advisory letters sent to other drivers.

Burglary Patrols around Kenilworth and Burton Green, 15 dedicated patrols were conducted by the team alongside our everyday patrols. Crime prevention advice and packs were given out during this time.
